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I. <u>Course Description</u>

This course is designed to introduce to students the fundamental issues of financial management and the relevant tools and techniques used to address them. The goal is to equip students with key concepts, theories, and skills to improve corporation's financial condition. This course covers the review of financial statements, application of interest rate theories, cost-and-revenue analysis (a case study of Apple Inc.), debt financing and equity financing. Upon completion, students will be able to make well-supported financial decisions for corporations.

II. Course Objectives

- 1. Identify a manger's role in financial management
- 2. Explain the key concepts of financial management and their connections
- 3. Demonstrate analytical skills to help with corporate decision-making
- 4. Challenge existing theories, and encourage critical thinking

- CLO1. Explain the corporate governance structure of firms and examine the interactions, from a governance perspective, between firm management, financial markets and stakeholders.

AT1: In-class participation

Students are expected to attend and participate actively in lectures. The purpose of AT1 is to help students learn and apply knowledge from lectures and the textbook.

AT2: Mid-term test

One mid-term test will be held as part of the continuous assessment of the course. No makeup test will be arranged if students are absent. The mid-term test weight will be allocated to the final examination for students who failed to attend the mid-term test, if and only if for medical reasons.

AT3: Group case study discussion and in-class presentation

Students are required to form groups (2 to 3 members in each group) to analyze the financial performance, financing or investing activities of a company listed on a Chinese Stock Exchange. Students are required to submit a written report after presentation. The report should be 5 to 8 pages. The group project is to help students to apply their knowledge learned from the course to real-life situation and improve their interpersonal skills and communication skills.

AT4: Final Examination

The final exam will be held in the normal examination period. It is closed book comprehensive examination which will cover all material listed in the course schedule. The objective of the final examination is to evaluate students' understanding of the concepts and theories taught in the course and their ability to apply their knowledge in business situations.
